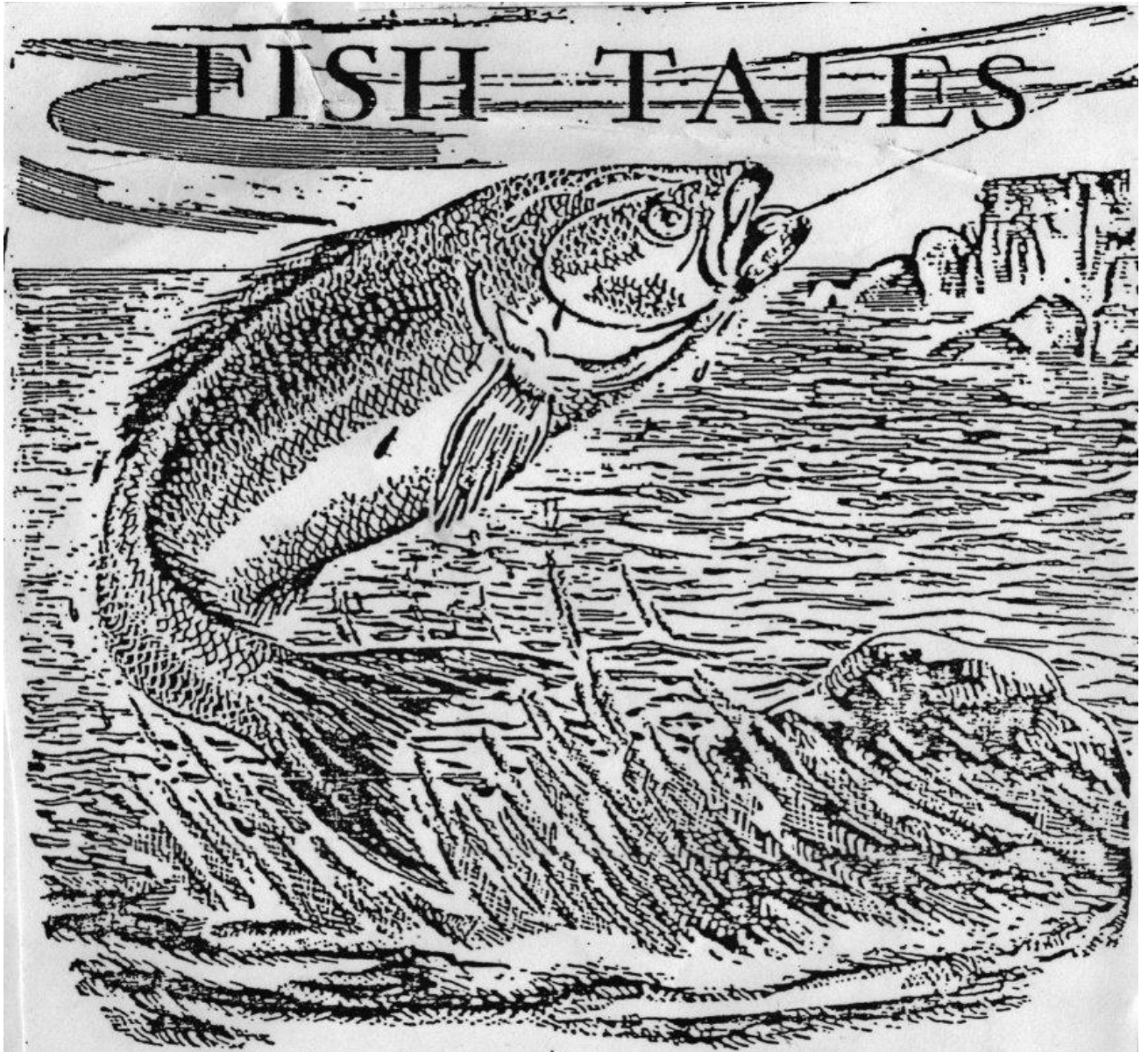

## WHAT FISH IS IT?

Body elongate, deep and strongly compressed. Dorsal profile strongly arched in front, it is rather low, which is not notched ventral profile almost straight. With age the females generally change to a well known shape. Eye small. Mouth of moderate size, horizontal, with peg like teeth in front and lateral molar teeth. Body covered with large cycloid scales, which are smaller on the head.

Colour pattern on body variable throughout life, the adults can be pinkish with bluish spots. Length to 32 inches.

They are edible, but it's doubtful if you will get the right type of fish when buying or asking for them as fish and chips.

Distribution: West Australia and South Australia and maybe Victoria. With a similar species on the eastern coasts.

WHOA!! Is the only way to describe the Cape to Cape Field Days. Over the 50-odd years the club has been going on Field Days, the Cape to Cape area has nearly always come out with the best catches.

**Elephant Rock:** The largest sampson fish, dhu fish, snapper, sharks and many other large fish have been weighed in from there.

**Hamlin Bay and Boranup:** All the salmon, skippy plus those 40cm herring, that members catch from those beaches.

**South Beach:** Who knows what come from this long stretch of Beach. It's a fisherman's dream.

**Contos and Bob's Hollow:** Some of the best catches the club has had have come from here.

**Redgate:** Large skippy, salmon, herring and reef fish are abundant.

**Gas Bay & River Mouth:** The skippy numbers have got to be seen; also many mulloway have been caught by those chasing salmon and tailor at the river mouth.

**Kilcamup:** South Kilcamup is where locals go for a feed of large skippy; North is great for herring, skippy and salmon.

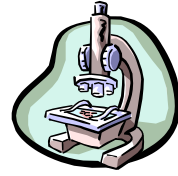
**Gnoocardup Beach:** Because of its inaccessibility who knows what comes from this area?

**Beaches like:** Cullens, Willyabrup, Moses the mulloway, large snook. Creek mouth at Quinninup. Cape Clairault, you have to hide behind a bush to bait up. Injinup and Mitchells tailor and salmon, herring. Smith Beach and Yallingup salmon, tailor. It would take pages to tell about the fish species in those beaches, but the Cascades is my top spot, but hard fishing conditions.

**Castle Rock:** Meelup, Eagle Bay, Bunkers Bay, The Quarries, everyone knows the huge salmon schools that come there for spawning, then there are the large snook, skippy and tailor of the quarries.

As the heading says Whoa.

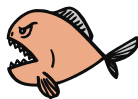
There will be a short meeting of a few minutes then one or two marine biologists will give short talks, after which members will be served supper refreshment, and you will be shown through where the scientists work, the educational lab, the exhibition hall, where you can travel the whole 12,000 km of WA coast and see all its marine creatures and fish. The ladies are sure to love it.

The building is the two-storey building on the **north side** of Hillarys Boat Harbour adjoining the Boat Ramp. **Not** the old concrete building at Watermans or AQWA on the south side. **It is important that you are in the building for the 7.00pm start**, as this is a secure building and nobody will be at the doors to operate their electronics after that time.

**You can bring a camera to take photos of animals and other articles in displays, but you are not allowed to take shots of live marine animals, fish in tanks or the glass aquariums, the flash at night cause them stress and sometimes kill them. It will be a great night for all members and guests. You will see some great and interesting marine animals and things.**
