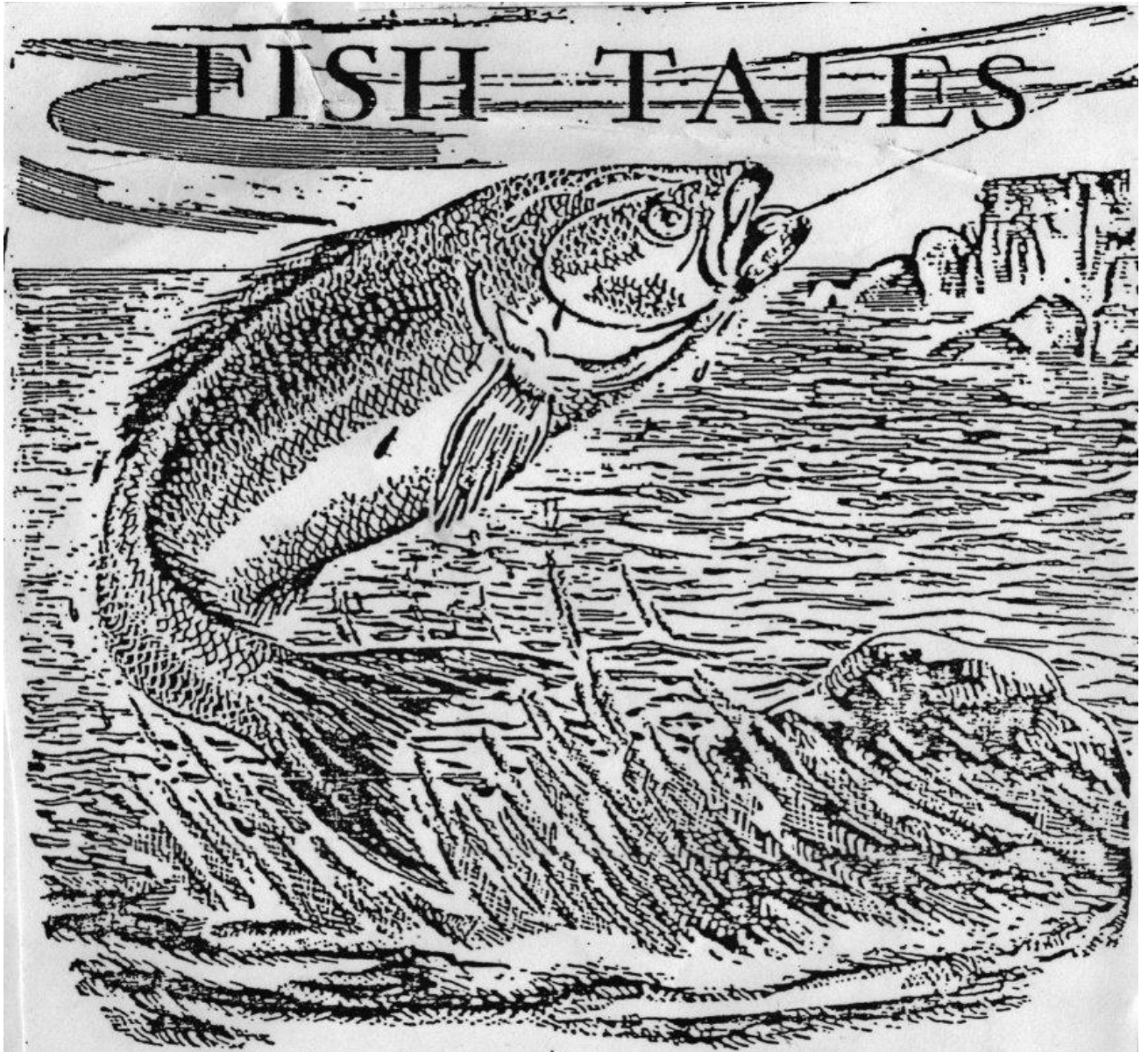

Last month we reported on the State Boating Championships held on 26 March. The report stated that an angler had his whole bag disqualified because of an 11kg Spanish Mackerel. I would like to clarify that the bag was disqualified due to other ineligible fish in his capture, and the mackerel was not the reason for its disqualification. My apologies.

A draft marine bioregional plan and a Commonwealth marine reserve network proposal for the South-west Marine Region have been released for public consultation. These drafts will be available for public comment for 90 days, concluding on **8 August 2011**. During this time **ALL RECRETATIONAL FISHERS** are encouraged to make a formal submission.

As I see it, the proposals are fair and equitable, but if we as a group do not comment, there is the possibility that more conservative bodies will have their way and **MORE** areas will be made unavailable for recreational fishing. ## WHAT FISH IS IT?



Body cylindrical and rather robust. Two widely separated dorsal fins, the first formed of short spines, the second of longer rays. The eyes large. Mouth with a large gape, extending almost to the front border of the eye, the lower jaw considerably longer than the upper jaw. Upper jaw with an outer single series of fine teeth, and four enlarged and curved canines in front, situated inside the former series. Lower jaw with a single series of small teeth, with two or three enlarged teeth on each side. Head covered with moderate sized cycloid scales, which are larger and thicker on lateral line.

Colour Golden-Brown above, silvery below. Length 51 cm.

Distribution: all southern States.

## **NATIONAL RECORDS**

Please note that protected species are not to be acknowledged for capture. All current protected species records are to be updated with a notation “that old records for all protected species such as Potato Cod and Great White Sharks now be marked as ‘Caught Prior to Being protected’.”

## **FEE STRUCTURE**

Below is a brief outline of the new fee structure. The fees have been set up to represent members attending all functions and not paying a daily fee or entry in AAA events, but instead having their annual fee cover all costs, except for the annual Trophy Presentation Social. The locals asked me to do her elegy at the Memorial on the cliff top on the unveiling day.

Tony Palumbo showed why he has been has been a past champion with his great bag of mixed species containing some nice large skippy from the Conti's area.

There were large herring at all the beaches and one would have to be unlucky not to catch a feed.

Most of the members that fished the northern areas fished Mitchell's on the Saturday, Greg Uren and Blignault Olivier fished the rocks and Laurie and Maurie the beach, and had to battle lots of weed and only caught herring. Blignault caught the only tailor, which he released. One member fished Fish Rock on Saturday evening, but the easterlies in their face made fishing very hard.

For those who fished Mitchell's on the Sunday, there was no weed and the tailor really moved in with members hooking one most casts. Mike Harrold would have been puffing, carrying the extra weight of his tailor back up the hill.

Jerry Morton and Lorena who didn't get to Dunsborough till 3.45am Saturday, fished the cold Saturday night on the Busselton Jetty for Mulloway to come through, but it was in vain.

## AAA NEWS

- The following motions are to be discussed at the June Delegates' meeting then voted on at the July Delegates' meeting:

It has been proposed to add new Section 3.1.4 to the AAAWA State Dry Casting Competition Rules, add new Section 1.4 to the AAAWA Competition rules for State Rock & Beach and Estuary Events, and append the following to Section 14 of AAAWA State Boat Angling Championship tournament Rules.

“The behaviour at the event of any persons acting inappropriately, aggressively or affected by alcohol or drugs shall be considered by the Disputes Committee and immediate action shall be taken to deal with the behaviour. Action may extend to disqualification from the event and removal from the venue and may include a recommendation about barring from participation in future events for some period. The decision of the Disputes Committee about action on the day or days of the event shall be final.”

Subject to the above motion being passed the following Motion is to be addressed:

Add to follow the words added in Motion 1.

“Any recommendation from the Disputes Committee for barring the person from participation in some future events for some period shall be presented to the Delegates Council meeting for decision. The presentation shall be made by one or more representatives nominated by the Disputes Committee. The person shall be given written notice of the recommendation and his right to make a verbal or written statement to the Delegates Council meeting. Any decision by the Delegates Council meeting shall require a simple majority of the Delegates Council present and voting, in accordance with Section 41 of the Constitution.”

### **5,000 REPORTERS ARE WATCHING**

*Keep Australia Beautiful's* litter report program has hit a record high with 5,000 registered reporters.

## KALBARRI – HOUSE FOR RENT

The Surf Casting and Angling Club owns a house in Kalbarri which is ideal for a fishing holiday in the area. Access to the famous fishing spots at Wagoë, Lucky Bay, Port Gregory, etc is just a short drive away via the bitumen road.

The Mallard Street house has easy access to the river, beaches and town. It has two bedrooms and will sleep up to eight (max) in 1 queen sized bed and 3 bunks. It has two reverse cycle air conditioners to keep you cool in the summer months and warm in winter.
